Sarah Beeching

As a Tiffin Girls' alumna (1981-88), I am proud to be a member of The Tiffin Girls' School Board of Governors. I studied economics at university completing an MSc at University of London. My first career was in Government where I spent 15 years working for the Department for International Development and Cabinet Office, specialising in international development. Since 2011, I have run my own social enterprise focusing on political negotiations and campaigns around girls' education, health and other social issues. I am a member of the Fellowship Council for the Royal Society of Arts focusing on Fair Education.

I had a very happy seven years at Tiffin Girls' from 1992-1999 and am so pleased to now have the opportunity to give back to the school that gave me so much: a fantastic education, high aspirations and friends for life. After Tiffin Girls', I read History at Exeter University and then gained my PGCE from Cambridge University. I started teaching in a junior school in Twickenham and completed an MA in education at St Mary's University. My teaching career has been varied thus far, working as a Year 2 and 3 form teacher and then a specialist history teacher in Key Stages 2 and 3. For three years I was Director of Studies at Danes Hill School in Oxshott, overseeing a wide-ranging curriculum for pupils aged 3 to 13.
